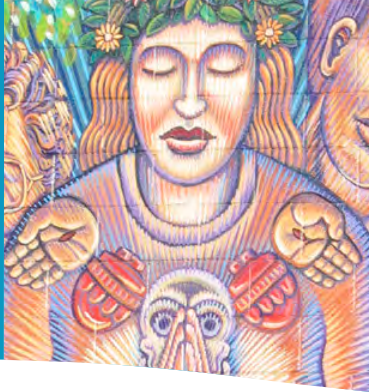

HONORING COMMUNITY HEROS

Dorothy Herrera Settlage

Consumer Attorney Dorothy Herrera Settlage has been a strong and dedicated advocate for consumers and community needs in her role at the Legal Aid Foundation of Los Angeles. As the foreclosure crisis struck, Dorothy was instrumental in revitalizing Advocates for Consumer Justice, an LA-based working group of consumer advocates, in early 2008. Recognizing that the foreclosure crisis required an array of strategies, Dorothy worked closely with LA-based housing counselors, in particular Los Angeles Neighborhood Housing Services, broadening the access to legal services for homeowners and tenants.

Communities for Clean Ports

Communities for Clean Ports is an important campaign led by EndOil in Long Beach which offers community-based solutions to end the port-related pollution that poisons people, fouls the environment – and costs billions of dollars in health care, and lost school and work days. Communities for Clean Ports offers education, leadership development, research, and strategic collaborations including ending truck pollution and developing local jobs.

United Neighbors In Defense Against Displacement (UNIDAD)

UNIDAD, a diverse coalition rooted in South LA's Figueroa Corridor, fights to ensure that redevelopment of low-income neighborhoods brings community improvement, not community replacement. UNIDAD's latest victory, a multimillion-dollar Community Benefits Agreement, ensures that the Lorenzo Project has much-needed benefits, including a community health clinic. Through community organizing, grassroots advocacy, and popular education, UNIDAD and the local community have a genuine voice in their neighborhoods' future.
