## Grantland Johnson

Grantland Johnson grew up in the Del Paso Heights Neighborhood. He has served as a member of the Sacramento City Council and the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors, Regional Director for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and Secretary of the California Department of Health and Human Services. Grantland was involved in the founding of many community and civic organizations in Sacramento including Mutual Assistance Network of Del Paso Heights. Grantland is a great mentor, visionary and advocate for economic and racial justice.

## Kathy Tescher

Kathy Tescher, Executive Director of the North Franklin District Business Association, has established a record of innovative and collaborative accomplishments. The business district is the premier Hispanic business district in Sacramento. Kathy's real passion is public art projects. Her "arts in business" philosophy led to the nationally recognized Franklin Urban Plein Air Project. She initiated the first Hispanic Business Walk in Sacramento with the Sacramento Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and the City of Sacramento for the North Franklin District.

## Transitional Living and Community Support

Paul Powell and Michael Lazar from Transitional Living and Community Support (TLCS) successfully developed 19-unit permanent housing for persons with mental disabilities in Folsom despite substantial community opposition. TLCS put their reputation and resources on the line over an eight-year period to do this in a community where there are limited housing options for this population. Folsom Oaks Apartments now provides 19 families with permanent, service-enriched housing located near transit, services, schools and other amenities.
